



Eva C. Maas Memorial Scholarship

Eva C. Maas was born and raised southeast of Battle Creek. She attended rural Madison County schools and later received a teaching certificate from Wayne State College in 1926. Mrs. Maas taught in the Knox County rural schools for two years before marrying her husband, Henry Maas. Mrs. Maas was proud of her teaching career, but chose to stay home to raise their child. The family lived in Madison, and later moved to Norfolk, living in the Grant Elementary School neighborhood. Mrs. Maas's love of teaching and desire to help young people was her purpose in setting up a scholarship with the Norfolk Public Schools, through her will, when she passed away in 1984. Her wish was to establish an endowment to create opportunities for students pursuing a post-secondary education at Northeast Community College.
